

November Scrapbook Page



You can use any sized photograph for this layout. I made a composite photograph on an instant photo machine in Boots.

Join the pink butterfly paper and the turquoise paper horizontally so that you have 8 inches of the top section and 4 inches of the bottom section as your first layer.

Cut a 1 inch strip of the burgundy paper and a 1 inch strip of the burnt orange paper (reverse of the large flower paper). Join these together so they slightly overlap. Do not glue down yet!

Cut 7 (½ inch by 3 inch) strips of the striped paper. Fold each one in half widthways. Fold each side of the strip down from the centre point to make a pointed hat shape. Attach these in a row at the bottom of the burgundy strip with the points facing downwards, trim off any excess paper. Glue in place approx 4 inches from bottom of page.

Mount photograph onto a turquoise mat leaving a narrow border.

Cut a section of daisy print paper 2½ x 7 inches. Cut 4 (½ inch by 3 inch) strips of multi patterned orange paper and the same again in burnt orange paper. Make these into points as before and attach to the left side of the daisy paper alternating the shades.

Fix this panel to the main page approx 2 inches in from the left hand side with the points facing left. The base of this panel should overlap the horizontal strips already in place.

Fix your mounted photograph in place so it slightly overlaps the flower panel.

From the die cut sheet push out the wavy border and unblock the holes. Cut in half and place half the strip across the bottom of the photograph and slightly to the right.

Cut a very thin strip of the burgundy paper $\frac{1}{4}$ inch wide x $6\frac{1}{2}$ inches and fix this horizontally to the bottom left of the page. Fix the remaining section of the wavy border above this.

Take the orange flower from the die cut sheet and add any journaling you wish. I used a combination of rub-ons, stamping and hand written lettering. Ink the edges of the flower and punch holes in the petals. Use any other elements from the die cut sheet and the jewels as desired.

To make the flower roughly cut 5 circles from patterned paper scraps decreasing in size. Distress the edges with a sanding block and agitate the edges between your fingers to soften and give a worn look. Join together with a brad.
